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Purpose and characteristics of the methodology

- there is not universal or common methodology on legal harmonisation
- it is applicable for legal approximation to the EU law, or legal harmonisation with international conventions
- designed following two-narrowed approach, addressed to EN countries and CA countries

Main Targets

- identification of the applicable national legislation, including subordinate implementing acts
- choosing relevant means, method and technique according to their relevance
- approximation of provisions itself
- check for inconsistency within the legal measure
- making the *acquis* compatible with the draft national act
- assessing the degree of compliance of the draft act with the relevant *acquis* provisions

Main tools

- **Questionnaire (checklist)**
- **Table of concordance**

Assessment of the degree of compliance – table II



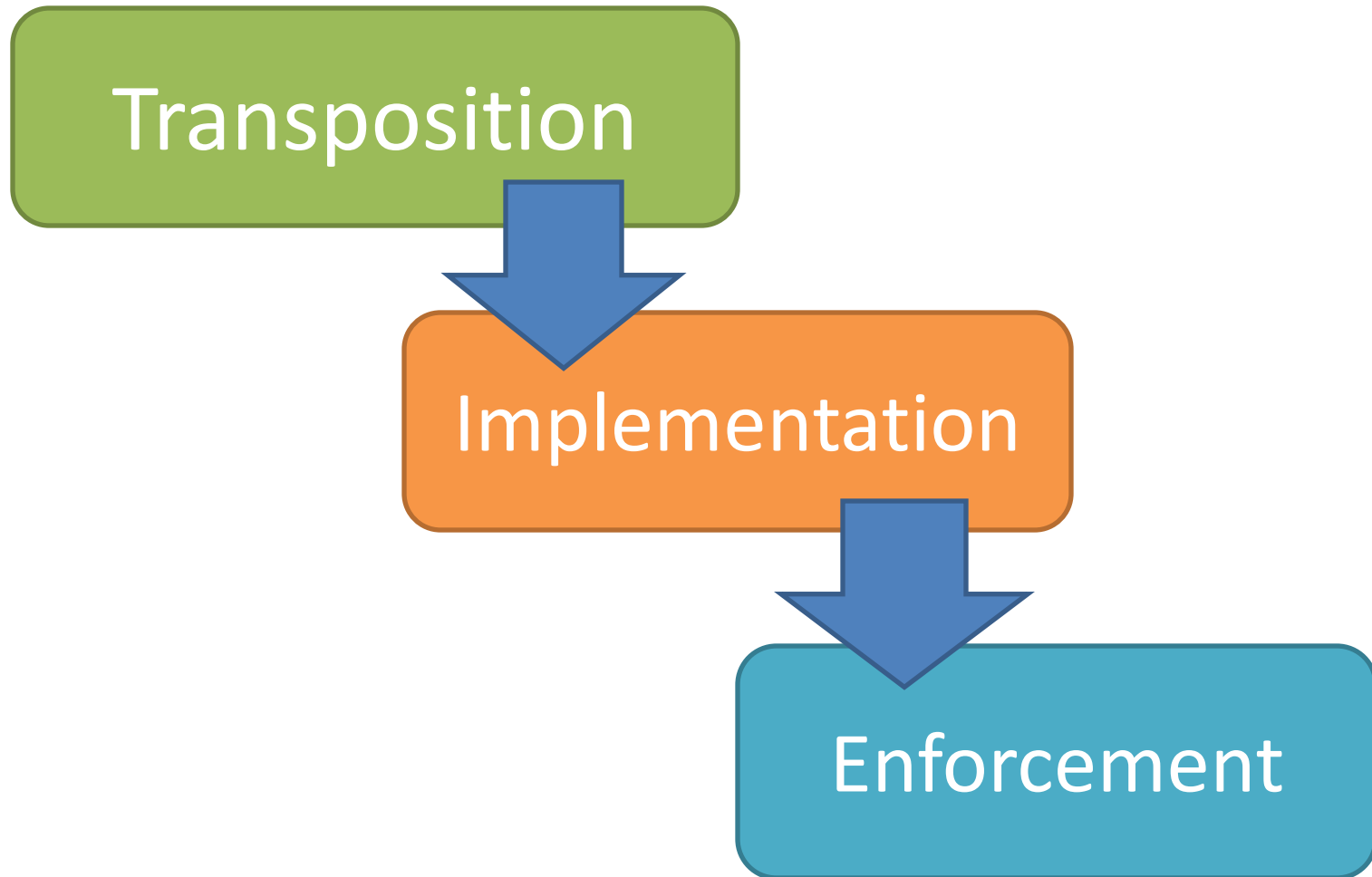
Progress Monitoring

acquis communautaire and international conventions and agreements are not fixed and once agreed do not remain constant but evolve

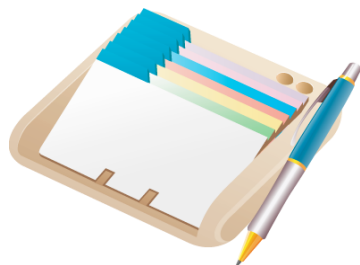
evaluating the level of implementation
