1. INTRODUCTION

Place and duration

The second Steering Committee meeting in the framework of the TRACECA Civil Aviation Safety and Security project took place in the premises of the Ambasadori hotel on the 16th of September 2010 in Tbilisi.

Attendance

The meeting was attended by 8 representatives of 6¹ of the 8 beneficiary States and by observers from EASA and TRACECA Permanent Secretariat. The list of participants is given in **Appendix A.**

Programme management and core team

Ms. Svitlana Didkivska, the Sector Manager of the Delegation of the EC to Ukraine presided over the meeting throughout its duration. Mr. Louis Gerlin, TRACECA Civil Aviation Safety and Security project Team Leader was Secretary of the meeting and was assisted by Mr. Thibault Raisson, Project Manager, Mr. Kakhi Kvatashidze, Deputy Team Leader, Mr. Peter Cooper, Security Expert and Ms. Ayce Celikel Environment Expert.

2. REPORT ON THE PAST AND UP-COMING Ω YEAR ACTIVITIES

Based on the draft Progress Report nr 3, the Team presented:

- The activities conducted during the past reporting period ñ February to July 2010 (attached as Appendix B)
- The activities planned for the next reporting period \(\tilde{n} \) August 2010 to January 2011 (attached as Appendix C)

After the presentations and further discussion, the Steering Committee validated the planned activities for the up-coming period and agreed on approval of Progress Report nr 3

3. DISCUSSION AND FEEDBACK FROM THE BENEFICIARIES

Ukraine

Air operator representatives had the opportunity to attend the workshops and training sessions on ETS organized in the framework of TRACECA Civil Aviation Safety & Security Project and workshop recently organized in Athens. The training sessions have been found very informative and as a result CAA has requested airlines performing flight operations to Europe to prepare their Emission and Tone/Kilometre monitoring plans before August 31, 2010.

It was highlighted that designated competent authorities did not reply on the monitoring plans presented by airline operators. Allocation of competent ETS verificators is a major concern of the CAA of Ukraine. This situation puts air carriers into difficult situation. This impediment could be raised at political level and addressed to EU DG Climate, pushing them to reply to the relevant letters.

In general, positive results of the all training sessions performed in the framework of the TRACECA are identified. However, practical results should be more visible.

Added value was provided to the National Aviation University throughout all the EU projects; inter alia, Twining, TEN-TE, and TRACECA. NAU has capacity to train students in different profiles regionally and globally. The idea of establishing cooperative relations with NAU for sustainability was welcomed.

A regional safety oversight organisation is established. Member states are identified as follows: Ukraine, Moldova Azerbaijan Armenia, and Turkey. Georgia expressed its interest for joining regional safety oversight organization.



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TRACECA Civil Aviation Safety and Security Project

From the list with proposed technical assistance options the Civil Aviation Administration is interested in technical assistance in Flight Crew Licensing. The delegate also requests for assistance OJT in OPS and AIR, as well as revision of the AIR handbook. Technical support has been requested on ETS implementation.

EC Delegation to Ukraine

There is a link between DG Climate and the TRACECA project. This contact should be used to make this sensitive issue more visible. The project should continue activities on ETS domain but in another format.

Apart from the TRACECA Civil Aviation project the EC is going to launch twining projects in Armenia and Georgia, TEN-T project in Ukraine is in progress. The project team should arrange coordinating meetings with the above mentioned projects to share information on project activities and to efficiently use available resources.

In the framework of technical assistance working package practical results should be more visible. Technical cooperation activities should be focused on the needs of each individual CAA depending on its the level development.

EASA

EASA highlighted strong request addressed by countries at International Forum to participate to training activities under EASA umbrella. EASA has structured its training plans and is ready for direct relations with beneficiary countries.

It was reminded to the participants that EASA is going to organize OPS Inspectors Training Course in October. The course will be very comprehensive, seats are limited. After deadline it will be difficult to accept participants. Only a few countries expressed interest to participate to the training session.

Georgia

New management is in position to improve institutional framework in Civil Aviation area to fulfil its obligations as provided for the Chicago Convention and establish an appropriately organised, funded and empowered civil aviation system that must be established on the basis of national legislation and structured to effectively fulfil the tasks which are expected to be undertaken.



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It was noted that since 5th March Georgia and the European Union initiated a comprehensive air services agreement between Georgia and the EU. The agreement is very important both for the EU and for Georgia. It will bring aviation relations to an entire new level. Georgia will gradually integrate into the European common aviation area.

Upcoming Institutional Twining project has been identified as the effective way to provide the assistance through two-way cooperation; it is anticipated to accelerate the capacity building of the Civil Aviation Department.

It was highlighted that TRACECA and Twining projects will enable Civil Aviation to come in line with EU experience and practices.

From the proposed list with technical assistance options Civil Aviation Department will benefit from high level technical assistance to improve institutional framework.

Azerbaijan

From the proposed list with technical assistance options Civil Aviation Administration will benefit from high level technical assistance to improve institutional framework. Option has been taken on the provision of inspector handbook in AIR, PEL and OPS.

Armenia

Since last SC meeting held in February 2010, progress was brought to the national legislation, enabling the National Regulator to implement regulatory requirements in English language.

Theoretical trainings aiming at improving general awareness on EU regulatory requirements in safety area have a positive impact on aviation in Armenia. At the end of the activities visible progress should be obtained in practical application of theoretical knowledge in the areas of AIR, OPS and FCL. Lack of practical exercises for inspectors this is a major concern addressed during SC meeting. However, organization of OJT for CAA personnel is part of the upcoming twining project.

Some beneficiary countries of TRACECA project entered into the working arrangements with EASA and therefore technical cooperation should be focused on the needs of each individual CAA depending on its the level development.

The national air carrier has started operating of Boeing 737 type aircraft. To effectively fulfil its responsibilities the State civil aviation must be properly staffed with qualified airworthiness personnel capable of accomplishing the required wide range of technical duties involved in safety oversight. With this respect technical assistance in terms of training of the airworthiness inspectors for Boeing 737 will be welcome.

Moldova

The effectiveness of project activities has been widely discussed amongst the participants of all training sessions. Based on the feedback provided by trainees, training sessions were found to be very positive measure for improving theoretical knowledge in the respective areas. However, the main concern is the lack of experience in exercising practical application of regulatory requirements in the areas of AIR, OPS and FCL.

From the proposed list with technical assistance options Civil Aviation Department will benefit from:

Part 66 license conversion procedure.

Developing of the CAP based on EASA validation mission findings in the field of AIR and investigation of accident / incident.

Kazakhstan

New Aviation Law is already drafted and sent to the parliament for formal approval. The primary legislation empowers CAA to certify all the service providers according to national regulatory requirements.

Technical assistance proposals will be discussed internally in the CAA and national focal point will provide the project team with feedback.

Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan

Telephone discussions have to be initiated with relevant SC members for identification needs for further TA.

TRACECA Team

Part of the requests addressed by the Beneficiaries is based on a proposed list sent prior to the meeting. The team would also like to stress on the fact that Technical Assistance can be delivered on other themes that those which were proposed.



PROJECT UPDATE

The past 6 months have been a busy period for the project with the technical training being conducted in the areas of safety, security and environment and at the same time a number of technical assistance missions being carried out.

There will be a further phase of training which will begin in February 2011 which will be divided into three distinct areas.

- Top level management training designed for senior personnel who operate at a strategic level within the aviation regulatory framework. This training will be delivered in Russian.
- Middle management training for operational managers working in Civil Aviation Authorities or Ministries.
- A series of train the trainer courses designed for staff involved in the development, assessment and regulation of mandatory training within the aviation sector.

STUDY TOURS

The TRACECA project is currently planning two study tours with the first one likely to be in April 2011.

The provisional framework for these tours is that the first tour will be to Cologne, Paris and Toulouse. This will enable delegates to engage with staff from EASA, ECAC and other European aviation agencies including those responsible for such areas as Safety Assessment Foreign Aircraft.

It will also allow delegates to visit Airbus Industries which will give an oversight of aircraft certification issues.

The second tour is likely to be to Poland where delegates will have the opportunity to meet with CAA managers and examine the implications for a Country moving from one regulatory framework to The EU system.

Letters of invitation will be sent out when the preparations are complete with a full agenda to give beneficiary countries the opportunity to select the most appropriate delegate.

A study tour has been arranged to Manchester in November this year for the benefit of Ukraine aviation mangers who will be dealing with the influx of people attending the European Football championships for Euro 2012.

It is hoped that the experience that will be gained in managing this major sporting event will then be shared with the other beneficiary countries as part of the regional cooperation programme.

STEERING COMMITTEE

The second steering committee meeting was held on 16th September and was hosted by Georgia in Tbilisi.



The committee was given a project update based on the 3rd progress report and an outline of activities planned for the next reporting period

The core team took the opportunity to highlight the strong links that **TRACECA** now has with EASA and the benefits in terms of expertise and training that this will bring.

Each beneficiary country gave an update on the current situation in their area relating to civil aviation and it gave a good opportunity to identify areas of technical assistance that the project can provide.

The committee and the core team were grateful for the help and hospitality provided by the Georgian Authorities.

COORDINATION WITH ICAO EUR/NAT OFFICE

On April 19th in Paris a meeting was held with the ICAO EUR/NAT Regional Office officials for formal coordination.

At present stage it allowed to exchange information on providing specific expertise support (Technical Assistance) to the respective beneficiary States.

At further stages of the Project exchange of contacts with the Safety regional officer can become useful, taking into account ICAO safety concerns and needs expressed by the countries, to finalise full Technical Assistance plan and schedule delivery of specific expertise support to the Civil Aviation Authorities concerned.



PROGRESS ON ENVIRONMENT

ENVIRONMENTAL TRAININGS

Two workshops are organised in the environment area

Initial environmental training program included 9 different environmental training courses. These courses were chosen after a detailed analysis of the training needs in each of the beneficiary countries.



These trainings are grouped into three workshop sessions. The first environmental workshop was held in Tbilisi during 17–21st of May.

This first session focused on basic concepts of environmental concerns related to aviation, Legal framework for environment in Europe and ICAO, Environmental Policy, Introduction to Environmental Management Systems (EMS), Collaborative Environmental Management (CEM) and Guidance on European best practices.

Second workshop is organised in Kiev 5–9th of July at the ICAO Training Institute in Kiev.

Following the first environmental awareness workshop, the second one was more technical level.

It included courses on best Practices and Method for Computing Noise and Emissions, ICAO Circular 303 including Operational Opportunities to Minimise Fuel Use and Reduce Emission, and ETS.

During the training there was also site visit in the NAU Hangar where participants had a practical exercise.

ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

ETS

During the assessment phase of the project ETS is defined as one of the priority areas in the environment section of the project. Therefore technical assistance is being provided in this area. In order to help our Beneficiaries to be prepared for the ETS verification and reporting cycle which is already started in 2010 several workshops are organised. As, it is important to meet the requirements of the EU ETS directive before the submissions date MRG plans is due.

Technical assistance team will provide support and guidance to help Benefici-





ary stakeholders to meet their obligations under the legislation. First ETS workshop is organised in Tbilisi 26–27th of July and the second one is organise in Kiev 29–30th of July. Participants from Armenia, Georgia, Ukraine and Moldova are invited for the first two workshops. The third ETS workshop is planned to be organised during October. It will be the continuation of the series of Tbilisi and Kiev and have the same technical content.

ECAC CONFERENCE, ISTANBUL, 24–25 JUNE

ECAC Aviation Training Conference is hosted by the European Civil Aviation Conference and the Directorate General of Civil Aviation.



TRACECA delegates from Ukraine, Georgia, Moldova, Azerbaijan, and Armenia are participated to the conference. The conference was found very interesting and informative by the participants and Ukraine delegate made a presentation during the conference.

Deputy Chairman SAA of Ukraine, Mr. Babeichuk stated the need for effective coordination between current and planned EU projects; avoiding duplication of activities, coordination on training programs and taking the outcome of previous project as input for a new one.

It was good opportunity for **TRACECA** participants to discuss training issues related to safety, security and environment from all over the world.

TECHNICAL TRAINING COURSES IN THE AREA OF SAFETY

Prior to other dedicated support actions towards regulatory convergence and safer aviation, a comprehensive Training Plan was agreed, covering Airworthiness, Flight Operations and Personnel Licensing. During the past 6 months focus was placed on delivering the courses. This covered the whole of the programme in Airworthiness (AIRW) and significant part of the courses planned in the areas of Licensing (PEL) and Flight Operations (OPS).

The attendance was excellent, with motivated trainees and generally all countries were represented. At the end of each course the participants filled assessment forms, where the trainees expressed their satisfaction regarding competence and availability of the trainers. In Safety a total of 566 training days was provided over 20 courses with average attendance of 14, 7 trainees.



EASA INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION FORUM IN DUBAI (UAE), 27 TO 29 APRIL 2010

On 27 to 29 April 2010, the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) held its International Cooperation Forum in Dubai (UAE). It welcomed more than 100 delegates from 50 countries and civil aviation bodies, which apply the EASA standards.

The aim of the Forum was to share experience and knowledge among states and authorities adopting EASA standards and to update the participants on the latest developments in European aviation safety legislation.

For this occasion, our **TRACECA** Civil Aviation Project was well represented with 5 participants from 4 Beneficiary countries at the International Cooperation Forum.



EASA PAN-EUROPEAN PARTNER WORKSHOP IN COLOGNE, 29–30 JUNE 2010

This event was organised by EASA for all countries having Working Arrangements with EASA (i.e. former JAA states).


Within this event the states are invited to share their own experiences after JAA ceased to exist and to discuss ways to enhance cooperation amongst them, EASA and other European Institutions.
