

#### inspections by flag (top 10)




ITF inspectors carried out 9,646 inspections\* over 7,486 vessels.





This shows the top 10 in terms of number of vessels with problems



#### port & flag state responses

- Paris MOU detained 113 ships for MLC deficiencies (17.4% of detentions during the period)
- AMSA & Transport Canada stand out as enlightened port State administrations
- Panama has funded repatriation of abandoned seafarers from Rotterdam
- Gibraltar has withheld certification due to delayed payment of wages
